Job Description

PRIMARY PURPOSE: To promote and enhance the mission of Harmony Academy; to provide individual therapy for students, family therapy, group therapy, wellness-based education for staff and students; and to collaborate with the team to improve student health and wellness.

BASIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

• Meet with new students to explain school therapist role and offer choice of meeting weekly, occasionally, or as needed, assess needs in and out of school, find out what other providers they are working with

- Schedule consistent meeting times with youth on caseload
- Participate on internal school teams and external behavioral health teams
- Provide therapeutic consultation with staff as needed to support students
- Consult with family and treatment providers as needed
- Seek and promote community referrals/resources for students and families
- Participate in student tours



- Assist in crisis and suicide assessment and intervention
- Assist with referrals to higher level of care
- Assist with recovery groups and offer mental health-related content in classes/activities
